The Northern Marianas College has been selected to receive nearly \$9.2 million in federal funding for its project, titled "Technology Partners Increasing Employment Through Coordinated Services (Tech PIECS)." The project will be led by Eileen A. Babauta, Director of the University Center for Excellence in Developmental Disabilities (UCEDD). Over the course of five years, the project will provide personalized advanced technology services and comprehensive transition and reintegration support to 200 individuals with disabilities. These services aim to enhance independence, education, and competitive integrated employment.

Project partners include the Office of Vocational Rehabilitation (OVR), the Council on Developmental Disabilities, the Center for Living Independently (CLI), and the Northern Marianas Technical Institute (NMTech). Key services provided through the Tech PIECS project will include technology assessments, technology training, career navigation, comprehensive support services (such as counseling, mental health support, and substance abuse treatment), postsecondary training, educational coaching, pre-employment services, work-based learning opportunities, job development and placement, and professional development
